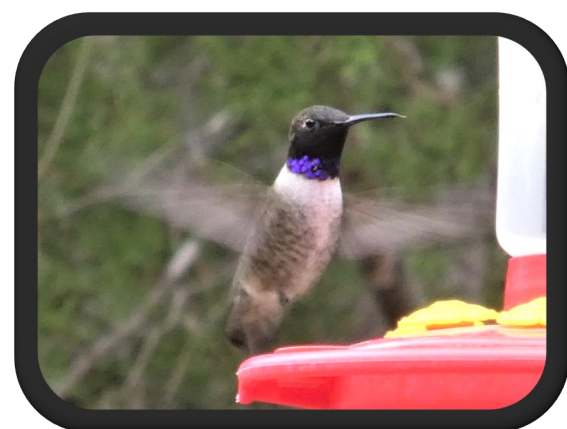


Phil Hardberger Park

Common Seasonal Birds

Although over 165 bird species have been documented on eBird as being seen at Phil Hardberger Park, about 84% are seen here regularly but not year-round. While some species are seen only during migration in Spring and/or Fall (Sp, Fa), other species are here only during their breeding season (Br) or only during their non-breeding season (Non-Br). Photos of 21 commonly seen seasonal birds at the park are shown here.



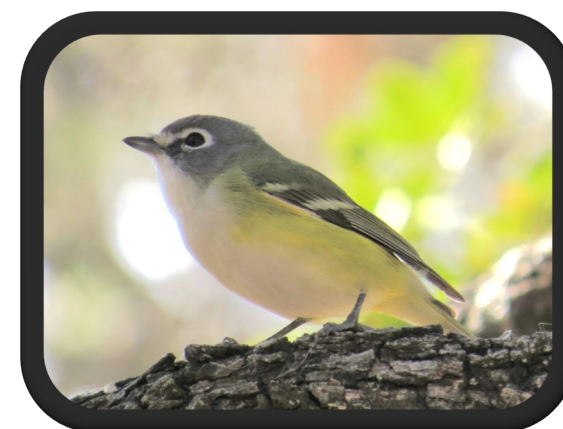

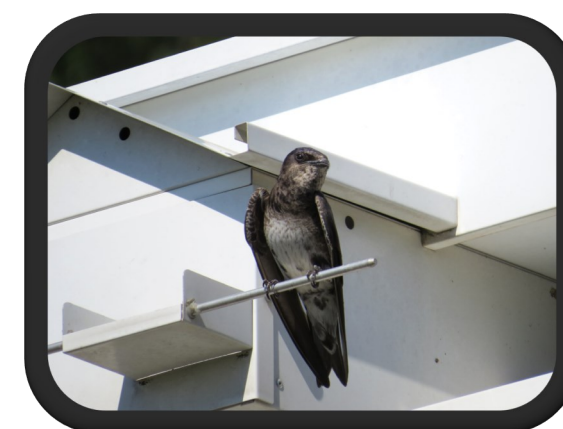
Great-crested Flycatcher (Br)

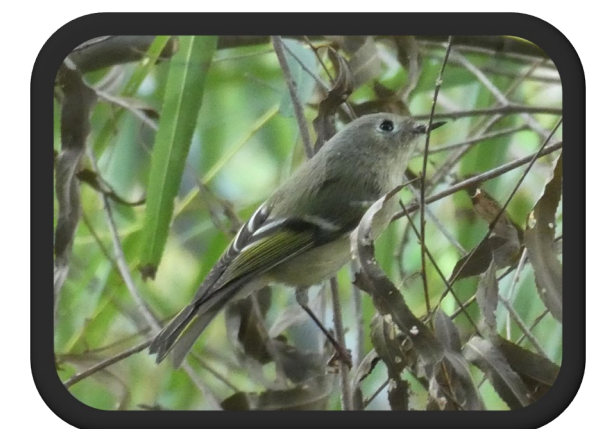

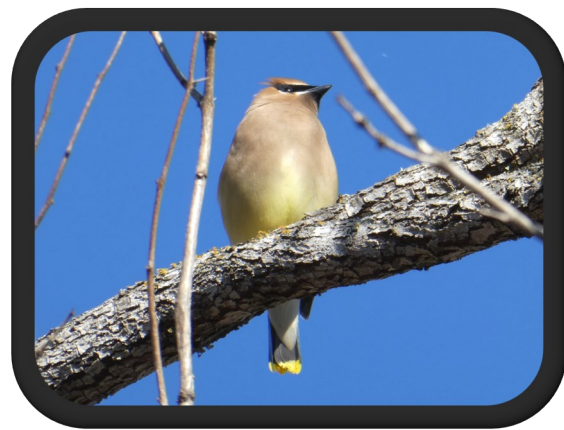

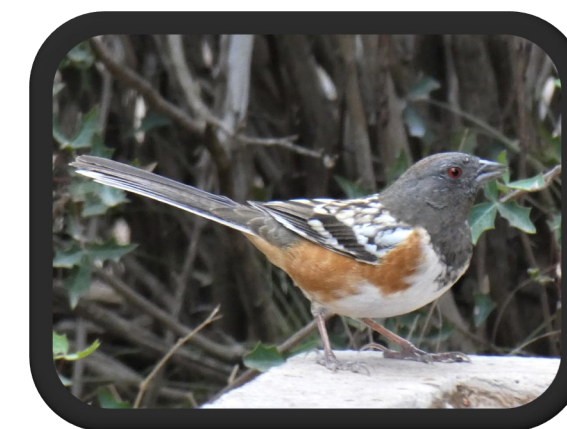

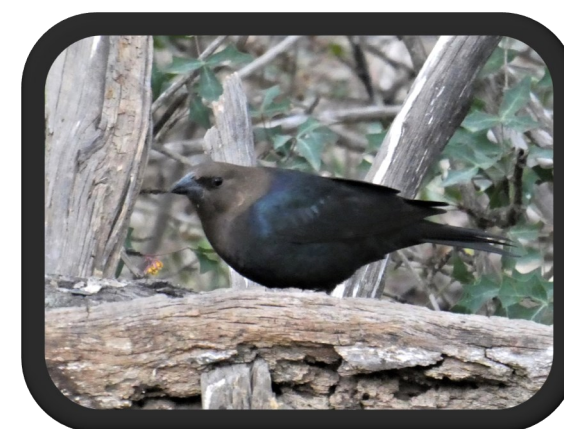
